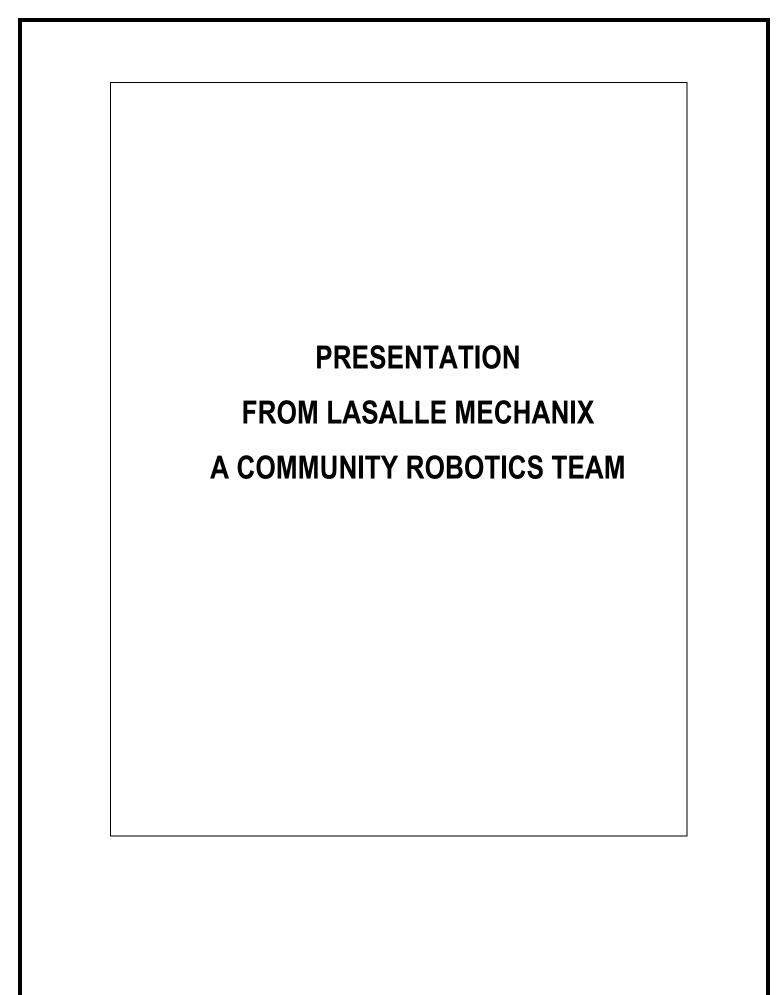

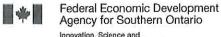
#### Report:

On June 22, 2016, the Town submitted four applications for the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure program. Under this program, the Federal Government will fund 33% of the total project cost. None of the projects submitted were selected for funding. In June 2017, administration received a letter from the Federal Economic Development agency for Southern Ontario indicating that funds may become available for this fund. The agency also wanted to know if the Town would be able to complete the "Improvement to LaSalle Trail Signage" project by March 31, 2018. The Town indicated that they could complete the project if they were granted the funds. Administration did not receive any correspondence until December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at which point the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario called administration with the same question as the June letter. The Town indicated that we will be able to complete the project by March 31, 2018 but may experience an installation delay depending on weather conditions. On December 21, 2017, the Town received the attached letter approving \$50,000 of funding for the "Improvement of LaSalle Trail Signage" project.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That the report of the Director of Council Services/Clerk dated January 2, 2018 (CL-02-18) BE RECEIVED and Canada Post BE ADVISED that the Town of LaSalle supports the use of LaSalle as the primary municipal mailing name for all addresses in LaSalle and further, that Canada Post BE REQUESTED to begin the change of address process for Canada Post customers in LaSalle who have been assigned a Windsor mailing address despite being geographically located within the Town of LaSalle.

#### REPORT:

Many LaSalle residents have historically been assigned a Windsor mailing address by Canada Post. This was due to the fact that Windsor was designated as the municipal identifier by Canada Post rather than LaSalle for many addresses in our community. Residents have contacted the Town in the past to complain indicating that they wanted LaSalle reflected on their mailing address rather than the City of Windsor. Previous inquiries to Canada Post about changing their mailing identifier to LaSalle were not successful.

Mayor Antaya recently contacted a representative of Canada Post, after another complaint from a resident, and it appears that Canada Post is now amenable to commencing the process of changing their address process for LaSalle customers whose present addresses use Windsor as the identifier. The representative asked for a resolution of support and this report is before Council to obtain same. It is especially timely if the process can be undertaken prior to the 2018 municipal election so that voter information notices can be addressed properly to LaSalle eligible electors.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That the report of the Director Council Services/Clerk dated January 3, 2018 (CL-04-18) regarding amendments to the Procedural By-Law arising from changes to the *Municipal Act*, 2001 BE APPROVED and consideration BE GIVEN to the amending by-law on this agenda.

#### REPORT:

In November 2016, the Minister of Municipal Affairs tabled Bill 68, the *Modernizing Ontario's Municipal Legislation Act (MOMLA)*. It introduced a series of reforms to the *Municipal Act*, *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act* and *City of Toronto Act*. The purpose of this report is to outline the proposed amendments to the Procedural By-law to incorporate the legislative changes.

#### Definition of a Meeting

Prior to the introduction of Bill 68, there was ambiguity about the definition of a meeting. Different closed meeting investigators used different opinions of what constituted a meeting and the Ontario Ombudsman's office had an expansive view of what constituted a meeting. The *Municipal Act* has been amended to clarify the definition of a meeting with the addition of a reference to quorum and materially advancing the business of the municipality.

#### Closed Meeting Exceptions

Bill 68 adds new exemptions for municipalities to meet in closed session. The Association of Municipalities of Ontario had long argued that municipalities needed greater flexibility to deal with certain items in closed session in order to protect the interests of the municipality. Accordingly, four new exceptions to the open meeting rules have been granted dealing with:

• Information explicitly supplied in confidence to the municipality or local board by Canada, a province or territory or a Crown agency of any of them

- A trade secret or scientific, technical, commercial, financial or labour relations information, supplied in confidence to the municipality or local board, which, if disclosed, could reasonably be expected to prejudice significantly the competitive position or interfere significantly with the contractual or other negotiations of a person, group of persons, or organization
- A trade secret or scientific, technical, commercial or financial information that belongs to the municipality or local board and has monetary value or potential monetary value
- A position, plan, procedure, criteria or instruction to be applied to any negotiations carried on or to be carried on by or on behalf of the municipality or local board

It is important to note that the consideration of business items will always be encouraged to be conducted in open session unless the subject matter strictly falls under one of the closed meeting exceptions. The additional exemptions are being recommended and are to be used with discretion.

#### Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest

Bill 68 requires members of council to submit their disclosures of pecuniary interest in writing to the Clerk at or immediately following the meeting during which they verbally disclose an interest. The Clerk is required to create a registry of the written disclosures available for public inspection. A form has been developed, attached as Appendix "A". Quantities will be left at each Council station in the Chambers and will also be available in electronic format. The registry of disclosures of interest will be posted on the Town website along with the agendas and minutes of council meetings to satisfy the public inspection requirement.

#### **Duties of the Chair**

For clarity, an amendment is proposed to formally acknowledge that the Chair has the right to move items for consideration on the agenda. Typically, the Chair has done this in order to address items with large numbers of delegations or in instances where a special request is made to deal with an item out of order so that individuals can honour other commitments.

#### Electronic Participation in Meetings

Bill 68 allows council members and members of local boards to participate in meetings electronically (by video conference call, Skype, phone etc) subject to incorporation in the Procedure By-law. The intention of this provision is to allow electronic participation by members in instances where a member cannot physically attend the meeting, not in instances when a member chooses not to be in attendance. Simply put, if a member is ill or injured and cannot leave his/her home, electronic participation may be allowed. If a member chooses to go on vacation or to attend a conference out of town, and therefore cannot physically attend the meeting, electronic participation is not an option. The member participating electronically cannot be counted toward quorum. There must be an in-person quorum of council members for the meeting to proceed. Electronic participation is not allowed at closed meetings, only open meetings.

At a recent meeting of the Clerks of the Essex County municipalities, this provision was discussed and no municipality is currently considering recommending electronic participation in meetings. Electronic participation in meetings was originally introduced for school board trustee meetings where a school board may encompass a large geographic area (especially in the french public and catholic boards) that makes it difficult for trustees to travel hundreds of miles to attend meetings.

Accountability and transparency measures put in place by legislation and incorporated into municipal council procedural by-laws are meant to increase transparency for the public. It can be argued that remote electronic participation would not support transparency as the public attending a meeting would not be able to view the remote member if that member was participating by phone. There may also be technology implications in establishing remote connections and perhaps additional costs. It could also be disruptive to the proceedings if video participation is enabled as the member participating remotely may not be able to control background noise and surroundings. A member participating remotely does not count toward quorum, but is allowed to vote. Given that a quorum of council members must be physically present at the meeting in order for it to take place, business can be conducted and actions taken without allowing electronic participation. For these reasons, Administration is not recommending incorporation of electronic participation provisions at this time.

#### Dear Heads of Municipal Councils:

Ontario continues to prepare for federal legalization of cannabis by moving ahead with its safe and sensible framework to govern the lawful use and retail distribution of cannabis as a carefully controlled substance within the province. On December 12, 2017, Ontario passed legislation that will regulate the lawful use, sale and distribution of recreational cannabis by the federal government's July 2018 deadline.

I am writing to provide you with an update on the provincial work underway to establish a retail and distribution channel for legal cannabis. I would also like to confirm the Province's commitment to engaging with municipalities on funding to help address the incremental costs associated with the implementation of cannabis legalization in Ontario.

Our objectives in the establishment of the retail and distribution system for legal cannabis are to protect youth and eliminate the illegal market. Municipalities are essential partners in the efforts to achieve these goals.

As noted in my October 27 letter, the various engagements the province has had with municipalities have been beneficial. Over the course of November and December, staff from the Ministry of Finance and the Liquor Control Board of Ontario (LCBO) met with staff of the municipalities identified for the initial cannabis retail stores for July 2018. These meetings provided valuable insights on provincial guidelines and areas of local interests that will inform store siting. I would like to thank the staff of these municipalities for their thoughtful feedback.

With the conclusion of the federal government's consultation with provinces and territories on the tax framework, we now have a better understanding of the revenue share to address the costs of legalization. During those discussions, we negotiated for a greater share of revenue on the basis that both the province and municipalities bear incremental costs. We now look forward to engagement with municipalities on a reasonable distribution of the province's share of the federal excise tax revenue. Given the federal government's forecasts of modest revenue and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' estimated cost projections, our engagement will need to acknowledge that it appears unlikely there will be enough revenue to fully cover the incremental municipal and provincial costs associated with legalization.

In January 2018, the Ministry of Finance will work with the Association of Municipalities of Ontario and the City of Toronto to launch an engagement process with municipalities on cannabis-related funding. This process will consider what is known about incremental municipal and provincial costs and set out a proposed approach to funding for municipalities that supports our shared policy objectives.

To help guide this engagement, I would like to propose the following principles:

- Address Implementation Costs An approach to funding should acknowledge
  that the province and municipalities will incur upfront incremental costs as a
  result of the federal government's decision to legalize cannabis and that a
  funding approach should focus on helping to address these costs.
- Respect the Role of Municipalities An approach to funding should recognize
  the efforts of municipalities in their areas of jurisdiction associated with the
  legalization of cannabis.
- Align with the Term of the Federal Tax Framework An approach to funding should align with the two-year term agreed to between the federal, provincial and territorial governments on the federal excise tax.

As we conclude the holiday season and reflect on the past year, I would like to thank you again for your meaningful engagement with the province as we all prepare for the legalization of cannabis in July 2018. Please accept my best wishes for the New Year.

# Non-residential Building Construction Price Index, third quarter 2017

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in The Daily, Tuesday, November 14, 2017

Contractors' prices for new non-residential building construction rose 0.6% in the third quarter compared with the previous quarter. Prices have increased across industrial, commercial and institutional building structure types since the fourth quarter of 2015.

Prices for new non-residential building construction were up in all seven census metropolitan areas (CMA) surveyed. Prices rose the most in Vancouver and Montréal (both up 1.0%). Contractors working in Vancouver reported a rise in the costs for architectural and structural building components due to higher material costs and a shortage of skilled labour.

Contractors in all seven CMAs surveyed reported higher prices for lumber in the third quarter, coinciding with the forest fires in British Columbia. According to the Industrial Product Price Index, prices for lumber and other sawmill products rose 4.1% from June to September 2017.

#### Non-residential Building Construction Price Index, year-over-year change

Contractors' prices for new non-residential building construction increased 2.9% over the four quarters ending in September, led by higher prices in Vancouver (+5.4%) and Montréal (+4.2%).

Since the beginning of 2017, the year-over-year price increases reported by contractors in these two CMAs have in part reflected higher prices for drywall and concrete. From January to September 2017, the Industrial Product Price Index recorded a 2.1% price increase for ready-mixed concrete nationally.

#### Note to readers

The Non-residential Building Construction Price Index is a quarterly series that measures the changes in contractors' selling prices of new non-residential building construction in seven census metropolitan areas: Halifax, Montréal, Ottawa–Gatineau (Ontario part), Toronto, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver. Three classes of structures are covered: commercial, industrial and institutional.

Selling prices include the costs of materials, labour and equipment, provincial sales taxes where applicable, and contractors' overhead and profit. The costs of land, land assembly, design and development, as well as real estate fees, are excluded. Value added taxes such as the federal Goods and Services Tax and the harmonized sales tax are excluded.

With each release, data for the previous quarter may have been revised. The index is not seasonally adjusted.

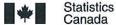

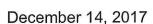

Dear Ms. Armstrong:

We appreciated receiving the letter you sent to the Prime Minister outlining the Town of LaSalle's concerns for the future of Canada Post. We note, in particular, the importance you place on ensuring that the Corporation reinvests its profits in services, provides high-quality, affordable letter and parcel delivery service, and engages in greening initiatives.

The Government has delivered on its promise to halt the conversion to community mailboxes and undertake a comprehensive review of Canada Post. An independent Task Force analyzed the Corporation's services and financial situation, conducted public opinion research, met with key stakeholders, and studied international best practices for postal delivery.

The Canada Post review includes two public reports from the independent Task Force and the House of Commons Standing Committee on Government Operations and Estimates. The complete reports include extensive input from Canadians and stakeholders and a thorough analysis of Canada Post's business. Both the Task Force's discussion paper and the Committee's report are available at canada.ca/canadapostreview.

The Government is considering the recommendations made in these reports and will bring forward a new vision for Canada Post, which is expected to be announced before the end of 2017. The results of the review will help shape the new vision for this iconic Canadian institution while preserving the quality services Canadians expect.

#### Recommendation:

Based on the direction from Council given during the 2018 Budget deliberations, it is recommended that Council accept the following proposal with respect to the 2018 Budget to arrive at a Municipal tax rate increase of 1.0%.

#### Report:

As part of the 2018 budget process, public budget deliberation sessions were held on December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017 to review the 2018 proposed budget, which was released in mid November 2017. At the conclusion of the sessions, Council passed the following resolution:

That the 2018 Operating Budget municipal tax rate increase BE ESTABLISHED at 1% and Administration BE DIRECTED to bring back the 2018 budget with the necessary reductions to achieve this amount; and further that Administration BE DIRECTED to meet with the Rowing Club to determine what financial contribution the Rowing Club could commit to over a period of time.

As Council is aware, over the past two decades, increases in taxation levels (net of growth) have been less than inflation and as a result, department managers have had to rationalize services in order to meet budgetary requirements. During this period, there has also been unprecedented growth in services and investment in capital, in particular in the past 15 years. In some cases operational efficiencies have been found while in other cases expenditures have been deferred / delayed. As a result, municipal departmental budgets have become very lean and there is now little or no room where reductions can be found without

affecting existing service levels. The existing proposed 2018 base budget has been reviewed in detail and there have been minimal areas identified where reductions can be found without reducing existing service levels.

The tangible objectives, which Council has identified as part of the Strategic Plan Committee and/or Council discussions (as part of budget and regular meetings) are generally beyond the existing budget provisions. As a result, in order to achieve these objectives there will need to be either a reallocation of existing funding from one area to another or an expansion in funding. As a result, Council can expect difficult decisions in the coming years in balancing financial restraint and achieving objectives beyond those currently in place.

#### Proposed Reductions

The reductions that have been developed are based on reducing the original proposed Municipal tax rate increase from 1.75% to the Council directed 1.00% increase. In order to achieve this reduction, the original proposed budget must be reduced by \$225,000. The following is a detail of the proposed reductions.

These proposed reductions include reductions of proposed service level increases that were included in the 2018 proposed operating budget. Reducing these proposed increases will delay the time it takes to fully fund these initiatives into future years.

#### **REPORT:**

The Culture and Recreation Department have committed to increasing awareness and growing fitness memberships at the Vollmer Fitness Centre as an operational goal and objective for 2018. In 2017, Council approved the investment of \$50,000 towards the purchase of new circuit and cardio equipment at the Fitness Centre. In December the Culture and Recreation Department hosted an Open House at the Vollmer promoting the new equipment and marketing a winter sale of 2018 fitness memberships. We also invested in marketing through print media, a social media campaign as well as some radio promotions. The results of the 2018 promotion and total sales of Fitness Memberships are included in the comparison chart below:

Flex Pass	12	16	33%
Bronze Pack of 11	18	39	117%
Annual Membership	65	68	5%

The promotion will end in January/2018 but the plan for marketing and promoting the fitness centre will continue throughout the year.

New this year will be the Free Walking Track, which was sponsored by Pathway to Potential. This free access will bring people upstairs to engage with the track and learn about the Fitness Centre. The plan is to engage the walkers to grow into fitness members. There will be programming created around the walking track to include a "10,000 steps" program, stroller striders for moms and Sneakers and Speakers for seniors.

Staff will focus efforts towards engaging the parents and family members who are in the aquatics and arena facilities to come and walk the track while their children are practicing or preparing for their games/lessons.

We are hoping to see revenue and membership continue to increase by 25% over 2017. Seasonal specials and the Vollmer 10 Year Anniversary will allow us to have specific marketing opportunities throughout the year. The slogan for the Fitness Centre will be "Fitness for Everyone" as we encourage residents of all ages to participate.

Under the provisions of Section 345 of the Municipal Act 2001 a percentage charge of one and one-quarter per centum (1 1/4%) shall be imposed as a penalty for non-payment of and shall be added to every tax installment or part thereof remaining unpaid on the first day of the month following the date when it falls due and thereafter an additional charge of one and one-quarter percent (1 1/4%) shall be imposed and shall be added to every such tax installment or part thereof remaining unpaid on the first day of each calendar month in which default continues up to and including December of this year.
- 5. The Treasurer-Tax Collector, not later than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date that the first installment is due, shall mail or cause to be mailed to the address of the residence or place of business of each person, a notice setting out the tax payments required to be made pursuant to this by-law, the respective dates by which they are to be paid to avoid penalty and the particulars of the penalties imposed by this by-law for late payment.
- 6. Taxes shall be payable to the Corporation of the Town of LaSalle and shall be paid to the Treasurer-Tax Collector at the Municipal Offices.
- 7. The Treasurer-Tax Collector shall be and he is hereby authorized to accept part payment, provided that acceptance of any such part payment shall not affect the collection of any percentage charge imposed and collectible under paragraph 7 in respect to non-payment of taxes or any installments thereof.
- 8. This by-law shall remain in force from year to year until it is repealed.
- 9. All by-laws inconsistent with this by-law are hereby repealed.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LASALLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Treasurer are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note from the Windsor Family Credit Union a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$17,000,000 to meet, until the taxes are collected, the current expenditures of the Municipality for the year, including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in Section 407 of The Municipal Act, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the Financial Institution a promissory note or notes, sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by the Treasurer, for the monies so borrowed with interest at such rate as may be agreed upon from time to time with the bank.

2. The amount of \$17,000,000 referred to in paragraph 1 of this by-law is applicable from January 1, 2018 to September 30, 2018. This amount shall be reduced to \$8,500,000 from October 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018. The amounts contained within this paragraph and paragraph 1 have been calculated in accordance with Section 407(2) of the Municipal Act

All sums borrowed pursuant to the authority of this by-law, as well as all other sums borrowed in this year and in previous years from the said Bank for any or all of the purposes mentioned in the said Section 407, shall, with interest thereon, be a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the Municipality for the current year and for all preceding years as and when such revenues are received.
- 4. The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed as aforesaid, together with interest thereon, all of the monies hereafter collected or received either on account or realized in respect of taxes levied for the current year and preceding years or from any other source which may lawfully be applied for such purposes.
- 5. The Treasurer is hereby authorized, on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note or other financial instrument from the Windsor Family Credit Union a sum or sums to meet the temporary borrowings required for the funding of capital works until such time that debentures are issued and temporary borrowings are repaid, and to give on behalf of the Municipality to the financial institution a promissory note or other financial instrument, sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by Treasurer, for the

monies so borrowed with interest at such rate as may be agreed upon from time to time with the financial institution.

- 6. The Treasurer is hereby authorized, on behalf of the Municipality to borrow from time to time, to a maximum of \$10,000,000 by way of promissory note or other financial instrument from either the Windsor Family Credit Union and/or Infrastructure Ontario a sum or sums to meet the temporary borrowings associated the Town of LaSalle Capital Projects. The Treasurer is authorized to give on behalf of the Municipality to the financial institution a promissory note or other financial instrument, sealed with the Corporate Seal and signed by Treasurer, for the monies so borrowed with interest at such rate as may be agreed upon from time to time with the financial institution.
- 7. The Treasurer is authorized to furnish to Windsor Family Credit Union a statement showing the nature and amount of the estimated revenues of the Municipality not yet collected and also showing the total of any amounts borrowed that have not been repaid.

### NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LASALLE HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

**1.** Section 1 Definitions - that the definition of "Meeting" be amended as follows:

"Meeting" means any regular, special or other meeting of a council, of a local board or of a committee of them where a quorum is present and members discuss or otherwise deal with any matter in a way that materially advances the business or decision-making of the council, local board or committee.

Add the following to the list of definitions:

"Point of Personal Privilege" means a matter that a Member considers to impugn their integrity or the integrity of the Council.

- **2.** Section 3, subsection (b), be amended to include "and further, to amend the order of the business items on the agenda"
- **3.** Section 5 subsection (3) be amended to add the following:
  - 7) Reports of Open Meeting Investigations of a municipality or a local board, where the Investigator reports his or her opinion that a meeting has been closed contrary to the open meeting provisions of the relevant Act will be considered at an open meeting of Council

- **4.** Section 10 Closed Meetings be amended to add the following exceptions:
  - Information explicitly supplied in confidence to the municipality or local board by Canada, a province or territory or a Crown agency of any of them;
  - k) A trade secret or scientific, technical, commercial, financial or labour relations information, supplied in confidence to the municipality or local board, which, if disclosed, could reasonably be expected to prejudice significantly the competitive position or interfere significantly with the contractual or other negotiations of a person, group of persons, or organization;
  - a trade secret or scientific, technical, commercial or financial information that belongs to the municipality or local board and has monetary value or potential monetary value; or
  - **m)** a position, plan, procedure, criteria or instruction to be applied to any negotiations carried on or to be carried on by or on behalf of the municipality or local board.
- **5.** Section 7 Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest be amended to add the following:
  - (5) at a meeting at which a member discloses an interest during the meeting or immediately after the meeting, the member shall file a written statement of the interest and its general nature with the Clerk of the municipality or the secretary of the committee or local board, upon the form provided by the Clerk.
  - (6) A registry shall be kept in which a copy of each statement filed and a copy of each declaration recorded. The registry shall be available for public inspection on the municipality's website.
