Subject: Specialty/Non-Traditional Crosswalk Policy Revisions

Recommendation

That the report of the Deputy CAO dated March 10, 2021 (PW-06-2021) regarding the Specialty/Non-Traditional Crosswalk Policy Revisions be received and that the enclosed revised policy be approved.

Report

At the February 9, 2021 Council meeting, report PW-02-2021 was presented to Council with a proposed policy to deal with specialty/non-traditional crosswalks. Council deferred a decision on the matter and referred the policy back to administration for changes and for staff to reflect on the comments submitted.

Again, this report is only dealing with seeking approval from Council on the policy only and not any specific crosswalk request.

Enclosed as Exhibit 1 is the previous report (PW-02-2021) which contains the original version of the policy. Enclosed as Exhibit 2 is the newly updated policy.

The changes are highlighted within Exhibit 2 and summarized below.

- The addition of two new terms under definition.
- New revised section 2.2 and the remainder of section 2 renumbering.
- Revised title to section 5.0.
- Revised section 5.7.
- Added section 5.8 to 5.11.
- Renumbered the remainder of section 5.
- Slight wording update/change in section 5.12.

The comments that were submitted as part of the February 8, 2021 Council meeting were also reviewed and where appropriate were incorporated into the new revised policy.

Council has several options available to proceed forward with this policy.

Option 1 – Council could approve the revised policy as presented.

Option 2 – Council could approve the policy with Council directed amendments.

Option 3 – Council has the option to not have a policy all together, which would result in not being able to install specialty crosswalks.

Administration is recommending proceeding with Option 1.
