 that the required storm water management plan be prepared by the Applicant (including an engineering analysis to confirm sufficient outlet capacity) and approved by the Town Engineer and ERCA Staff;

- that the EA Addendum being prepared by Dillon Consulting be finalized and in effect, permitting a permanent storm water management pond on the subject land;
- that all identified road allowances be conveyed to the Town;
- that 1 foot reserves be created and conveyed to the Town at the northerly extent of Meo Boulevard and Cremasco Street;
- that a subdivision agreement be entered into with the Town to ensure that: all
  required municipal infrastructure and services are designed and built by the
  Applicant to the satisfaction of the Town; that all required financial
  contributions be made and/or secured to the Town; including all required
  letters of credit, cash, securities and insurances, and the necessary costsharing/financial contributions are made to ensure that the recommendations
  of the final approved storm water management plan are implemented;
- that cash-in-lieu of parkland be provided to the Town, in accordance with the Planning Act requirements;
- that Block 86 be conveyed to the Town for drainage purposes;
- that Block 85 be dedicated to the Town for storm water management purposes; and
- that the subject property be rezoned from Residential Holding Zone "R1(h), Residential Four Holding Zone - "R4-7(h) and Recreational Zone - "RE" to Traditional Neighbourhood Design, Residential One (TND-R1-1) -"TND-R1-1.
