Dear Mayor Antaya,

We are conducting an airshow at Windsor Airport on May 27-28 featuring the Canadian Forces Snowbirds. As part of this event, we are requesting that the Snowbirds overfly Windsor, LaSalle, Amherstburg Essex, Lakeshore and Tecumseh. To do this, requires a letter from you authorizing the Snowbirds to overfly LaSalle. This letter must be on official letterhead and contain the phrase "as low as 500 feet". I have attached a sample letter for your consideration. This letter and phrasing does not guarantee that the Snowbirds will participate in this flypast or fly as low as 500 feet. It is a planning piece needed to get the necessary approvals from municipalities and the Royal Canadian Air Force. Should an approval from the RCAF be given, we will advise of the date and time of the flypast. Thank you.
