Subject: Increase in recreation program fees for 2023

Recommendation

That the report of the Director of Culture and Recreation dated September 12, 2022 (CR-2022-35) regarding an increase to recreation program fees for programs taking place in 2023 be received;

And that the recommendation to increase 2023 program fees by 10% beginning with winter program registration, which starts on December 5, 2022, be approved.

Report

In 2022, the minimum wage rate increased from \$14.35 per hour to \$15.00 per hour on January 1 and again to \$15.50 per hour effective October 1. In total, minimum wage has increased by 8% since 2021. As minimum wage increases, other part-time wages are increased correspondingly.

In an effort to reduce the impact of these increased costs on the Town, it is recommended that 2023 program fees associated with the cost recovery of part-time employee wages be increased by 10% beginning with winter program registration which starts on December 5, 2022. Examples of fees that would increase include swimming lesson registration fees, program registration fees and day camp registration fees to name a few. This increase will also help to cover projected part-time wage increases in 2023.

Due to the timelines related to approvals for the 2023 budget, the recommended increase in fees is being brought forward in advance of the budget in order to incorporate the new rates into winter program registration. Schedule F of By-law 8670 (A By-law to establish User Fees or Charges for Services, Activities or the Use of Property) will be updated for the November 8 Council Meeting.
