## 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

#### **Audit Objectives:**

- To evaluate the conformance of the QMS (as implemented at the facility) to the requirements of the Drinking Water Quality Management Standard (DWQMS) version 2.0, April 6, 2017,
- To identify and correct nonconformities with the facility's documented QMS, and
- To assess the effectiveness of the QMS and ensure that it is continually improving with each cycle.

A description of the LaSalle Distribution System is located on pages 3 to 5 of the Operational Plan. The Owner and Operating Authority are named in the first paragraph of the Description of the Distribution System and there have been no major changes to the drinking water system since the last revision date.

A description of the drinking water system has been provided along with a map of the system (September 2016). This map should be updated to also clearly indicate the location of all the emergency interconnects with the Amherstburg Distribution System and the Tecumseh Distribution System along with any other additions over the last two years.

There are also no procedures in place to maintain disinfection residuals however the description indicates several times that ENWIN supplies sufficient secondary disinfection to meet all regulatory requirements within the LaSalle Distribution System.

OFI – The water distribution map on page 5 should be updated to clearly indicate the location of all the emergency interconnects with the Amherstburg Distribution System and the Tecumseh Distribution System along with any other additions over the past two years.

# Responsibilities Under the Statutory Standard of Care - Safe Drinking Water Act

#### Course Overview

The Standard of Care course is designed to inform municipal councillors and officials of their oversight responsibilities under Section 19 of the Safe Drinking Water Act, which came into effect on December 31, 2012. Severe penalties are possible for municipal officials who fail to act in good faith and do not exercise honesty, competence and integrity to ensure the protection and safety of the users of municipal drinking water systems.

Several examples of waterborne disease outbreaks are examined which highlight the importance of competent oversight. The course describes some general information about drinking water systems, the multi-barrier approach to drinking water treatment and some of the risks associated with drinking water production and distribution.

The participant will also learn about additional specialized training that is available.

## **Target Audience**

This course is designed for mayors, councillors and municipal officials with oversight responsibility for drinking water treatment and/or distribution systems.
